

DANGEROUS GOODS SHIPPING IN DOMESTIC & INTERNATIONAL ROAD TRANSPORT WITH DHL EXPRESS

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTATION OF DANGEROUS GOODS BY ROAD (TDD & DDI)

ALLOWED:

DHL Express accepts dangerous goods and articles for domestic express shipments (DHL Domestic Express) and international road transportation (DHL Economy Select) if their carriage can be exempted in accordance with ADR Chapters 1.1.3.4. and 1.1.3.9. This concerns exemptions by special provisions according to Chapter 3.3, dangerous goods which are transported in composite packaging according to Chapter 3.5 (exempted quantities) and Chapter 3.4 (limited quantities) and dangerous goods which are used as refrigerants or conditioning agents during transportation.

Biological substances, category B of UN 3373 are only permitted for national shipping using the DHL Medical Express product. The prerequisite for this is the application of ADR packing instruction P650.

Please note the legal requirement that you as the shipper of the above-mentioned dangerous goods must have sufficient knowledge through training/instruction in ADR.

NOT ALLOWED:

- Dangerous goods that cannot be transported via exemptions according to ADR 1.1.3.4 or 1.1.3.9
- Dangerous goods of the following (sub)classes:
 - -Class 1: Explosives
 - -Class 2.3: Toxic gases
 - -Class 6.2: infectious substances (except UN3373)
 - -Class 7: radioactive substances
 - -Dangerous goods with high hazard potential according to ADR 1.10.3
- UN 3373 and UN 1845 (only applies to the DHL Economy Select product)

Please note that no additional agreement is required for national dangerous goods shipping (TDD), provided that the "Regulations for the transportation of dangerous substances and objects in national express shipping" are complied with.

Dangerous goods shipping with Economy Select (DDI), on the other hand, always requires an additional agreement.

In addition, the shipment of dangerous goods with the TDD and DDI product is subject to a surcharge for dangerous goods requiring labeling.

SHIPPING DANGEROUS GOODS BY INTERNATIONAL AIR TRANSPORT WITH DHL EXPRESS

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE INTERNATIONAL TRANSPORTATION OF DANGEROUS GOODS (TDI)

DHL Express accepts dangerous goods that have been declared according to the current "IATA-DGR" regulations.

 **ALLOWED:**

For the DHL Express Worldwide product:

1. Dry ice (UN1845)
2. Excepted quantities as per Chapter 2.6 of the IATA-DGR
3. Lithium batteries (UN3091, UN3481) under Section II of PI 966 - 967 or PI 969 - 970
4. Lithium batteries (UN3090, UN3480) under Section IB of PI 965 or PI 968
5. Dangerous goods in air transport that do not simultaneously require a transport document according to ADR Chapter 5.4 or are not subject to ADR
6. Biological substances, Category B (UN3373), and genetically modified microorganisms (UN3245). These are exclusively allowed for shipping via the DHL Medical Express product. A supplementary agreement must be concluded for the use of this product.

Please note the legally and regulatory mandated training requirements, according to which the shipper must possess the following knowledge:

for 1), 2), 4), and 5): Task Module A according to LBA (shipper)

for 3): Adequate instructions according to IATA-DGR 1.6 for shipping Section II lithium batteries

for 6): Adequate knowledge in packaging regulations 650 or 959

DHL Express verifies the necessary knowledge of the training prescribed by the IATA-DGR in an audit of the shipper.

 **NOT ALLOWED:**

- Dangerous goods of the following (sub) classes:
 - Explosivstoffe Class 1: Explosives
 - Class 2.3: Toxic gases
 - Class 6.2: Infectious substances (except UN 3373)
 - Class 7: Radioactive materials
- Dangerous goods with high hazard potential according to ADR 1.10.3 and IATA-DGR 1.7.3

Please note:

The international shipping of labeled dangerous goods (TDI) incurs an additional charge and requires a supplementary agreement to the transportation contract. Additionally, the shipment of dangerous goods with TDI is only possible to specific countries. For further information on this, please contact DHL Express Customer Service.
